The 2013 mate of this German Kastanie is an unrelated German Kastanie. Because this corn snake mutation was discovered and therefore bred longer in Europe than we have been breeding them here, it has the more common general overall coloration of Kastanie Mutants bred in Europe. The red head is much more common in those bred in Europe than many of the ones we have produced in the past few years in the U.S.. Eggs from SMR German and American Kastanie Mutants will begin hatching in late June.
