



Our Lava Terrazzo corns are F²s of wild-caught Boyd-Line Terrazzos and have no other Terrazzo blood in them. These generally have less pattern and more of the signature Boyd-Line Terrazzo colors (generally more tan than the JMG-Line Terrazzos). Terrazzos were originally called Granite corns for their predominant pattern-less, freckled look, but that name was *jacked* to label Anery Bloodred (aka: Diffused Anery) mutants over a decade ago when forum participants decided the name Granite was more appropriate for the blacker Bloodred (Diffused) Anery mutants. The non-Lava forms of these Terrazzos have a distinctly granite appearance, since most of this line has very little striped markings. Breeding a Boyd-Line Terrazzo to Striped mutants will render no striped progeny (unless respective Terrazzos have one gene copy of the classic Striped mutation). BTW, being a representative of an **insular** corn snake race, this snake demonstrates the typically slender body conformation that is classic for Rosy Rat (Key Corn) types, relative to the stockier mainland races of corn snakes.
